Delhi, 5 other HCs to get new chief justices

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court collegium on Tuesday elevated five judges as chief justices of high courts, and transferred Satish Chandra Sharma, chief justice of Telangana high court, to the Delhi high court as its chief. The recommendations made by the collegium, comprising Chief Justice of India NV Ramana and justices UU Lalit and AM Khanwilkar of the apex court, will come into effect following orders issued by Centre.

The collegium elevated the Delhi high court's acting chief justice Vipin Sanghi as chief justice (CJ) of Uttarakhand high court, two judges of Bombay high courtjustice Amjad A Sayed as CJ of Himachal Pradesh high court and iustice Sambhaii Shiwaii Shinde as CJ of Raiasthan high court. Guiarat high court judge Rashmin M Chhaya was elevated as CJ of Gau-

In three high courts, appointment was overdue as the posts of CJ was lying vacant in Uttarakhand since December 24, while at Rajasthan and Delhi, it was due since March 7 and 13, respectively. In Himachal Pradesh, the incumbent CI Mohammad Rafig will be demitting office on May 24, while the vacancy at Gauhati arose following the elevation of CJ Sudhanshu Dhulia as judge of the Supreme Court on May 7. Justice Dhulia took oath as judge of Supreme Court on May 9. Justice Satish Chandra Sharma, who has been recommended as the new CJ of Delhi high court, belongs to the Madhya Pradesh high court and was appointed as a high court iudge in January 2008. Similarly, Justice Bhuyan recommended as the CJ of Telangana high court belongs to the Gauhati high court.

Justice Shinde, a judge of the Bombay high court who has been recommended by collegium to head the Rajasthan high court, had courted controversy last year after he heaped praise on Stan Swamy, a tribal rights activist who died in custody after he was arrested by the National Investigation Agency in the Bhima Kore-

K'taka anti-conversion ordinance gets guv nod

BENGALURU: Karnataka Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot on Tuesday gave his assent to the ordinance that gave effect to the Karnataka Right to Freedom of Religion Bill, 2021, also known as the anti-conversion bill.

"An ordinance to provide for the protection of the right to freedom of religion and prohibition of unlawful conversion from one religion to another by misrepresentation, force, undue influence, coercion, allurement, or by any fraudulent means. according to a government note.

"Whereas the Karnataka Legislative Assembly and the Karnataka Legislative Council are not in session and the Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka is satisfied that the circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action to promulgate the Ordinance..... read the gazette notification.

desh and Madhya Pradesh, the bill was passed in the assembly in December last year, but it was not tabled before the state's upper house, where the ruling BJP is one short of a majority.

The Karnataka government promulgated the Karnataka Protection of Right To Freedom of Religion Ordinance on May 12. An ordinance can be brought for six months when the legislature is not in session. It has to be converted into law within six weeks of the start of a session. or else it will lapse.

The bill proposes imprisonment from three to five years with a fine of ₹25,000. For violation of provisions concerning minors, women, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. offenders will face imprisonment from three to 10 years and a fine of not less than ₹50,000.

Road, rail communication disrupted in many parts of Northeast; large tracts of cropland under water

Floods leave 12 dead in Assam, Arunachal

SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT GUWAHATI

Floods and landslips have so far claimed the lives of 12 people in Arunachal Pradesh and Assam while at least eight are missing in these two States since May 14.

Officials in Arunachal Pradesh said that at least five people died and several were injured following landslips in two areas of State capital Itanagar since May 15 night.

Heavy rain delayed rescue operations but the personnel of the National Disaster Response Force, State Disaster Response Force and other agencies managed to save six people, including two women, from the debris at the two locations.

Arunachal Pradesh Chief Pema Khandu mourned the loss of lives and advised people living along the banks of rivers and streams and landslip-prone areas to take precautionary

ary relief camps and people in vulnerable places may either shift there or to other places till the situation returns to normal," he said.

In Assam, floodwaters killed two people in Cachar district while another person died in a landslip in Lakhimpur district on May 16. At least three people died in a landslip in Dima Hasao district, taking the death toll to six while an equal number of people are reported missing in flood-hit Cachar district.

An update provided by the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) on May 17 morning said the State received an average rainfall of 592.6 mm from March 1 to May 16.

Officials said floodwaters have affected 20,587.32 hectares of cropland and three rivers - Kopili, Barak and Kushiyara – are flowing above the danger mark.

"We are trying our best to restore train services, but the quantum of damage is too high to be addressed within a short time," a Northeast Frontier Railway officer said.

Heavy rain has also caused extensive damage to roads and other infrastructure in Meghalaya with at least one steel bridge having been swept away in the Garo Hills region of the State.

An iron bridge in western Assam's Tamulpur district was also washed away.

Same-sex marriage: HC raps govt. for objecting to livestreaming

It asks Centre to file fresh affidavit before next date of hearing

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday expressed displeasure at the Union government's affidavit opposing livestreaming of the hearing in the pleas seeking legalisation of same-sex marriage.

The Bench of Acting Chief Iustice Vipin Sanghi and Justice Navin Chawla refused to take this affidavit on record and directed the Centre to file a fresh one before the next date of hearing on August 20.

Terms like sympathy As the matter came up be-

fore the Bench on Tuesday, one of the lawyers for the petitioners, senior advocate Neeraj Kishan Kaul, highlighted that the Union government was opposing the livestreaming of the hearing by using terms like "sympathy" and "hallucination".

He submitted before the court that the affidavit demeans the rights of same-sex couples - rights that were recognised by the Supreme

Opposing the livestreaming of the hearing in this case, the Union government had taken the stand that the issue was not of public inter-

'Not in public interest'

It had gone on to allege that the petitioners were trying to "create hallucination" of public interest in the matter to purportedly "sensationalise" it by allegedly "creating unnecessary hype".

After hearing Mr. Kaul's contention, the High Court asked who had vetted the affidavit and when the government counsel said that it is yet to come on record, the Bench asked that it not be brought on record.

The court went on to say that the government needs to bring the affidavit on record "if there is anything objectionable" in it. The court also said that such an affidavit cannot come directly from the Union government and that it should be vetted. "Don't do a mindless exercise. This is not done," the court said.

Following this, the Union government submitted in court that it would file a better affidavit in the matter before the next date of hearing.

The petitioners who sought livestreaming of the proceedings said that nearly seven to eight per cent of the country's population was interested in knowing the developments in the case and thus argued that it should be

Himachal Pradesh's education system is in shambles: Sisodia

"The education system in Himachal Pradesh is in shambles as government schools lack basic infrastructure and quality education, while fees in private schools are very high as the State government has given them free hand to loot the people," Mr. Sisodia said.

He alleged that there is only one teacher in 2,000 government schools and only two teachers in 6,500 government schools in the State. "Similarly there are 10,000 schools in the State which have only one or two classrooms," he said, adding that 47% of the government schools do not have a

Mr. Sisodia claimed Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's model of governance positively changed the education system in the national capital in five years by providing quality education in government schools and fixing fees in private schools.

'Give AAP a chance' Mr. Sisodia urged the voters in Himachal Pradesh to give one chance to AAP in the coming elections so that it can provide quality educa-

tion in the State. The AAP leader did not visit any government school in Shimla or address students and parents during his visit. He said he would visit schools during his coming

Though Mr. Udde denied the cubs were injured. a video of the incident showed one of the tiger cubs limping and some people throwing stones.

Jharkhand orders probe into new govt. buildings

The Jharkhand government on Tuesday ordered a probe by a judicial commission into alleged irregularities in the construction of the State Assembly building, inaugurated nearly three years ago, and the new High Court.

A portion of the false ceiling on the first floor of the State Assembly building collapsed in May last year reportedly due to leakage in the roof, raising questions over the quality of construction of the structure.

Questions were also raised about materials used in building the new High Court.

Alleged irregularities

Chief Minister Hemant Soren had in July last year ordered a probe by the Anti-Corruption Bureau into the alleged financial irregularities in the construction of the new buildings.

The government, in its communication, did not mention about the progress of the investigation by the anti-corruption bureau into the alleged irregularities.

The three-storeyed Assembly building, constructed at a cost of ₹465 crore, was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on August 12, 2019, 19 years after the State was carved out of Bihar.

The foundation stone of the building was laid by former BJP Chief Minister Raghubar Das in 2015. Previously, the State Assembly was functioning from a building of the Heavy Engineering Corporation.

Byculla prison's anganwadi leads the way

Children of women serving time are taught, told stories and provided nutritious food

There are a total of 11 children of prisoners who are currently living inside the women's jail in Byculla, with their mothers serving time. This is one of the few prisons leading the way for the anganwadi system to be instituted across the country.

The landmark judgment delivered in 2006 by the Supreme Court of India in R.D. Upadhyay vs. State of Andhra Pradesh had stated. "There shall be a crèche and

a nursery attached to the prison for women where the children of women prisoners will be looked after... The prison authorities shall preferably run the said crèche and nursery outside the prison premises."

Set up in 2012

Based on years of advocacy work by Prayas, a project by the Centre for Criminology and Justice of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), the first anganwadi for children living in prison was set up at the Byculla Central Jail outside the prison premises in 2012, under the Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS). Since then, seven more anganwadis have been set up in prisons through the ICDS, with four of them outside the prison premises.

Seema*, who works closely with the Byculla jail authorities said, "As per the counting done last month, there are 11 children in Byculla jail and according to the ICDS, there is an anganwadi outside the jail set up 10 years ago. It is run by a teacher and a helper, and since it is a government

post, the teacher is paid ₹8,000 monthly and the helper is paid ₹4,000. They teach kids the basic alphabet, tell stories, make them identify images. It is run like a nursery for kids above the age of three."

Lives like a family She explained that each time a child enters the prison, the child welfare committee (CWC) is informed about it. After the age of six (when the law does not permit children to be brought inside prison), they are sent to their families or placed in the CWC, if no relative is willing to take the child. Inside the

jail, everyone lives like a

family – there is no barrier

of class, caste or religion. "Earlier, children would not [be able to] identify the family because they wouldn't see each other for years. Now, that has changed, and because of the *mulakat* system, the children are aware of who is who. If the child stays in the CWC, no one there knows that they have come from jail. They are given a nutritious diet in jail and the CWC, consisting of eggs,

milk and rice," Ms. Seema

In prison, the child and mother are kept in a separate barrack, with other mothers and children. Civil rights activist Sudha

Bharadwaj, who was first lodged at the Yerawada Central Jail and then the Byculla jail for almost four years in the Bhima Koregaon caste violence case, also reiterated the same.

She said, "In Byculla and Yerawada, there is a nursery outside the prison where children from age three to six go. This facility was, however, stopped during the COVID-19 pandemic. There is a separate place for the mothers to live with their children inside the jail. In Yerawada, there is a small area outside the prison where children go and play. They also get a special diet of chappati, sabzi, khichdi, eggs and bananas."

A guide by the Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative, an international NGO working for practical realisation of human rights in the Commonwealth, titled 'Standards behind bars: Security rights of women prisoners' in the year 2020,

Interaction with mother It mentions, "The prison administration must ensure that the child be placed in a manner that he/she can interact with the mother regularly at least once a week. In case the child is in the care of family/friends, the women inmate should be allowed to call every day for a week, and thereafter at least twice a week, for a reasonable time to be in touch with the child or the

caregiver of the child." However, according to a report dated March 31, 2021, by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights titled, 'Education Status of Children of Women Prisoners in India': "It was observed that children above six years were allowed to visit their mothers in Byculla prison at least once every quarter and children from Yerwada jail visit their mothers once a month."

City's Civil Service Coaching Centre Faces Fee Harassment Charge

Srinagar: Shabir Ahmed Mir, a graduate from Budgam studying to become a civil servant, has accused "Ignited Minds" of harassment over pending fee installment.

The said coaching centre is an uptown Srinagar-based Institute offering preparatory courses for civil service examinations.

For civil services examinations, the Institute has a norm of accepting fees within two Installments. But after Shabir's request, it agreed to take the fee in three segments.

Shabir was entitled to pay an amount of Rs 78,000 in three installments, of which he paid Rs 32,000 as first installment. After attending classes for a month, Shabir was told to pay another installment.

"I failed to pay the second in-

stallment in time and that is when the harassment started," Shabir told Kashmir Observer.

Due to financial restrictions, he sought more time to pay the fee but he said his request was denied.

"On 16th April, I was called out of the class for not paying the fee on time," he said.

Let down by what Shabir calls "marginalizing behavior" of the Institute he did not feel like studying at the Institute anymore.

However, talking to Kashmir Observer, Ignited Minds Director Waseem Raja denied the accusations and said that students are entitled to pay a fee within two installments.

"In case of Shabir, we agreed to take a fee within three installments as requested by Nazir who happened to be faculty member at the Institute," Waseem said.

"The student not only failed to pay the fee on time but also misbe-

haved with the faculty members at the Institute and his brother threatened me with severe consequences."

Waseem said he reported the issue at Police Station Baghat. In charge SHO Police Station Baghat Mukhtar Ahmad told Kashmir Observer that he talked to both the parties and the issue has been resolved amicably.

"The Institute has agreed to give more time to Shabir to pay the fee, no further action is needed," the SHO told Kashmir Observer.

Meanwhile, another student, Adil Rasheed from Khan Sahab Budgam said that he paid an amount of Rs 80,000 as fee for a year and was denied a refund by the Institute.

"I was not satisfied with the level of teaching, so I requested them to change the faculty or refund the fee, they denied both," said Adil, who is no longer interested in joining classes at the Institute.

They said it is very important to make people aware that cotton seeds of female poplars do not induce any allergic con-
